

Our adventure began on the thirteenth of March 2004 when our group, consisting of 31 participants young and old alike, set out to climb Mt. Kinabalu. We trained vigorously for three months with the sole purpose of scaling Mt. Kinabalu and believe me, nothing could deter us.

Situated at an altitude of 4100m, Mt. Kinabalu is the highest peak in South East Asia. We had heard many stories about failed missions and tortuous mountain trails but we remained undaunted and became more determined to conquer Mt. Kinabalu. We decided nothing was going to stop us.

Prior to our maiden attempt at climbing this majestic mountain, we went out to equip

Besides climbing Mt. Kinabalu we had also included sightseeing and witnessing cultural activities as part of the mission.

We arrived at Kota Kinabalu on the thirteenth of March, travelling on the famous AirAsia. After a few days of sightseeing and island hopping, we were ready for our much anticipated climb.

Our climb began early in the morning on the seventeenth of March from Kinabalu Park. After the photo session, we set out in groups of four and five. The first leg of our journey was manageable. Some of us thought what all the fuss was about, but we were in for a shock. After three or four hours, the journey uphill became much more challenging. Many of us were already starting to feel the strain.

We had to traverse narrow paths in the thick jungle. At times, the paths were slippery and formidable but we persevered. We encountered rough and tough mountain terrain. Some of us encountered thirsty leeches but that did not weaken out spirits.

The climb was most nerve-wracking but we motivated and encouraged each other to keep going. Some of us were able to psych ourselves up to look ahead for the resting stations which were positioned every two to three kilometres apart. Arriving at these stations where we had only short lived respite, felt like paradise!

After a strenuous 8-hour climb, we finally reached Laban Rata Resthouse. Our fatigued bodies ached so much that we tumbled into a long and deep sleep the minute our heads touched our pillows. Laban Rata Resthouse was and is the only accommodation available and as far as we were concerned, at that time it was equivalent to a five-star hotel. Ten of us were cramped into one room and we did not complain. At times, the biting cold and thin air really made us wonder why we were there, enduring such inhospitable conditions when we could have been at home with our families.

A bowl of instant noodles cost RM 10.00 here but feeling so hungry, I think we would have paid any price quoted. After devouring some 'haute cuisine', we went to our 'suite'. Showering was the last thing on our minds and we fell asleep immediately as weariness had numbed all our senses. Even the howling wind which broke the silence of the night did not trouble us. We were too tired to be troubled by the eerie sounds.

The next part of the climb to the summit started at 2 a.m. after a short briefing by our guides. The real challenge and test of skill and endurance started here, when some of the members had to ascend 80-degrees steep granite slopes by hoisting themselves up with ropes. After several hours of sheer torture, some of us reached the summit while a few dropped out along the way.

The feeling of triumph and achievement was indescribable and those who reached the summit felt absolutely euphoric. After a brief photo session they started their descend towards Laban Rata. Our journey downhill from Laban Rata began at 11.00 a.m. It was relatively easy going downhill and we reached Kinabalu Park at 3 p.m. We were tired but with deep sense of relief and a profound sense of achievement.
